

FROM THE PASTOR... “BECAUSE OF YOU...”



Some people at Immanuel have asked me, “Scott, as a part-time pastor, what do you do on days when you’re not in Ceresco or visiting Immanuel’s members and friends in Wahoo or Lincoln?” Well, for those of you

who may not know, I am also a part-time fund development consultant with an Omaha-based consulting firm. I help non-profit organizations organize and conduct capital campaigns to raise millions of dollars for new programs that help people create new buildings and programs. Currently, I’m working with libraries in northeastern Kansas and central Nebraska as well as a kayaking group and a Habitat for Humanity chapter in Nebraska. I get to meet a lot of interesting people in that line of work. My most unique client, four years ago, was Alaska Family Services where I used to commute to Anchorage from Lincoln every four to five weeks to work up there for a year and a half.

One of the most important things that I’ve learned in fund development (or what some people call “fundraising”) work is to thank people who give. People enjoy knowing that they are making a difference in the lives of others. Heading through the Spring season at Immanuel, this is a good time for me to say “thank you” to all of you who are making a difference in the Ceresco area and throughout our world. Because of your generosity, we recently had about 30 teens who experienced a fun overnight lock-in at our church. Because of you, we hosted Dave Ramsey’s

“Financial Peace University” and helped a number of Ceresco area families and individuals get out from under debt or learn about stewarding God’s money more effectively. Because of you, there is a growing positive feeling among people in our community for Ceresco’s three churches and pastors working together in community worship, a Passover Seder meal shared during Holy Week, and Vacation Bible School in the summer. Because of you, our community of Immanuel is making a positive difference in the lives of children at Camp Carol Joy Holling near Ashland, countless people who are fed, clothed and housed through Lutheran World Relief, and other ministries Immanuel supports. YOU are making a positive difference in our world for Christ. Thank you.

I want to thank you for your gifts of time, talent and treasure to and through the mission of Immanuel. I am truly blessed to be a part of this faith community and privileged to be called your pastor. Thank you for being you and your generosity of time, talent and treasure.




**NEW CHURCH CONSTITUTION WRITING IS




PASTOR SCOTT'S SUMMER 2018 PREACHING SERIES


