

Work as Worship

Some thoughts from Pastor Scott

As followers of Jesus, it's sometimes easy to separate the "sacred" from the "secular" when it comes to our jobs, careers, and callings. We might think that only pastors, counselors, and missionaries do "ministry" but a person who goes to work from 9 to 5 in the secular workplace isn't also a servant of God. Sometimes it is easy to feel like we cannot worship God while we are working at a cash register, changing diapers, selling real estate, answering phones, or driving a grain truck. But, whatever line of work we might be in, the fact of the matter is that God can be honored and His kingdom can be advanced as we do our jobs.

There's only one pastor at Immanuel to shepherd all of the members and friends of our church. But, it's not just the pastor who's serving God throughout the week, it's all of us. How we live our lives and how we do our work is our chance to worship God and glorify Him. Each of us has the opportunity to find joy in the places to which God has called us, and we all have a chance to bring God glory wherever we might be each day.

In Ecclesiastes 3:9, King Solomon asks, "What profit is there to the worker from that in which he toils?" Do we only work to earn money for money's sake? If so, we will be disappointed. Solomon says in Ecclesiastes 5:10, "He who loves money will not be satisfied with money, nor he who loves abundance with its income. This too is vanity." When God is factored into the equation work can take on its right and full purpose. God has made work for us. Even before sin entered the world, God gave Adam a garden to tend. (Genesis 2:15). *Work plays a certain role in how we interact with God, and the only way to understand the purpose of work and to enjoy our work and the fruit of our labor is by also enjoying God as we work* (Psalm 16:11).

Doing our work in love and holiness is important (John 13:34-35, Hebrews 12:14). When possible, we should seek to share the gospel of Jesus with co-workers by sharing His love and grace with them as well as inviting them to Sunday worship (Acts 1:8).

Our factory, shop, or vehicle is our mission field. Colossians 3:23-24 says, "Whatever you do, do your work heartily, as for the Lord rather than for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the inheritance. It is the Lord Christ whom you serve."

The best thing we can do is to live as sacrifices that please Him even as we work (Romans 12:1-2).

This month, as we celebrate Labor Day, may God teach us and enable us to honor Him in and through our work, whatever our specific line of work might be. Next time we go to work, let us go to worship.



Come join us during the Sunday School hour (9 a.m.) at Immanuel as Pastor Scott leads us in a study the Old Testament book of Ecclesiastes. This book is loaded with wise teaching about how to live life and make the most of the time God gives us on this earth.

The book of Ecclesiastes contains proverbs, maxims, sayings, and is largely an autobiographical story of King Solomon. Solomon wrote it late in his life, around 935 B.C. He had become aware of the mistakes that he made throughout his life and began to write about them. The purpose of Ecclesiastes is to spare future generations the suffering and misery of seeking after foolish, meaningless, materialistic emptiness, and to offer wisdom by discovering truth in seeking after God.

The Nebraska Brass is coming to Immanuel Thursday, Oct. 25th at 7:30 p.m.



