Some thoughts from Pastor Scott

"Cast your cares on the Lord and he will sustain you; he will never let the righteous be shaken." – Psalm 55:22

Things were going well for the Spafford family. Horatio, a prosperous Chicago lawyer was making good investments in properties along Lake Michigan. He and his wife Anna were blessed with four daughters and a son. They were living comfortably in the Lakeview neighborhood on Chicago's north side – a wealthy part of the city.

Then a series of tragedies struck. First, the Spafford's four-year-old son died of scarlet fever. A short time later the great Chicago fire of 1871 damaged many of the properties that the Spaffords owned. Then 1873 brought an economic downturn that dealt a blow to Horatio's businesses.

In late 1873, needing a break, the family decided to travel to Europe. Horatio needed to stay in Chicago to take care of some business with his properties so Anna and the girls went on ahead of him by ship. Then, on November 22nd the ship that Anna and the girls was on was hit by another ship and sank.

Anna hung on to floating debris and was one of only 47 people who survived. Her four daughters drowned. When she reached Europe she sent a telegram to Horatio saying, "Saved alone".

The grieving Horatio quickly traveled to be with his wife, Anna. As his ship passed their area where his daughters had died, he wrote the hymn "It is Well". The first verse says, "... when sorrows like sea billows roll; whatever my lot, thou hast taught me to say, 'It is well, it is well with my soul."


How did Horatio deal with so many tragedies in his life? He put his worry and his pain, as overwhelming as they were, in Jesus' hands.

This month, we celebrate Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter. It's the time of year that reminds me that we worship a God who knows what it is to suffer and lose everything – his followers who ran away from him, almost losing hope as he called out from the cross "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" and losing his life shortly afterwards. But, thank God, the story doesn't end there. He rose again on Easter morning and is with us through our struggles and troubles in life. Isn't it good to know that we have a God who is with us through the good times and the bad?



2022 Quilt Auction

Join in this exciting day at Carol Joy Holling Camp on July 30 for our 34th Annual Quilt Auction! The day promises good food, great fun, and lots of beautiful quilts donated by friends of Carol Joy Holling Camp. The auction and lunch will be held rain or shine. (We will use the Town Hall in case of rain.) Bring your friends and families!

Quilts will be on display by 9 a.m. **The live auction begins at 9:30 a.m.** We will continue until all quilts are sold, which is usually around 5 p.m.

The quilts will have numbered cards attached indicating the order in which they will be auctioned. This way bidders can approximate when their favorite quilts will be up for auction. The cards also include information about the quilt donor and the size, type, and design of the quilt.

Through the years, quilts have auctioned for \$25 to \$20,000. Lance Larsen, a professional auctioneer from Cordova, Neb. volunteers his time to auction the quilts. He and his associates will do their best to encourage bidding and bring a fair price for each quilt.

The silent auction will be on Qtego, a mobile bidding site, again this year. Bidding will open at 2 p.m. on Friday, July 29, and end at 1:30 p.m. on Saturday, July 30.

You won't want to miss the lunch with dessert and drink served from 11:30 a.m. until 1 p.m.

You are encouraged to attend the Quilt Auction to see your quilts sold and possibly meet the buyers. If you or someone else from your congregation cannot attend, you may call the camp office at 402-944-2544 to find out how much your quilt sold for. You can also check on our website, <u>CJHCenter.org/quilt-auction</u>. We keep the sale prices updated throughout the day of the auction. You will receive a postcard after the auction with the results of your quilts.
