My 90-year-old great grandfather had seen the last and youngest of his children die before him. I don't remember much of that week or the funeral but I do remember that the old man, it the living room of my grandparents' house, asked me, "Do you ever read your Bible." And I replied, "Not much." I had a Bible, but it wasn't the most interesting thing my 12 year old self possessed. So, he told me through some tears, "Well, you should." It was one seed I remember being planted in my walk with Jesus.
